





The Political Economy of Ecological Change and Economic Security in the Global South

1-2 July 2024

University of Cambridge

The INET-YSI workshop, jointly organised with the Centre of South Asian Studies, University of Cambridge, will delve into the political economy of ecological change and economic security in the Global South. The conference will examine the distinct regional and local ecological conditions that influence livelihoods and natural resource management systems. It will underscore the profound impact of the climate crisis on vulnerable communities. The conference will draw attention to the paradox of the Global South bearing minimal historical responsibility for climate change yet facing significant vulnerability, thus complicating economic security as resources are redirected to adaptation and mitigation. Despite these challenges, collaborative efforts and mitigation initiatives are emerging, driven by states, grassroots movements, and indigenous methodologies. These efforts aim to enhance ecological practices, drive socio-economic reforms, and foster sustainable development. Advanced doctoral students and early career scholars will participate in this two-day conference, focusing on themes such as sustainability and resilience, human-environmental interactions, and the interplay between climate change and migration.
